Hamman Relative Invents the Iron Lung

Ben Hammonds found this interesting article in the New York Times about a Hamman relative of note. He posted this recently on the Hamman Facebook page. The 1964 news article about Dr. Charles Morgan Hammond. Dr. Morgan is a descendant of William Cook Hamman (1796-1870) and Elinore Rowe.

1964 New York Times:

"MEMPHIS, Feb. 16 (AP)—**Dr. Charles Morgan Hammond**, who said he invented the first iron-lung type of respirator more than 60 years ago, died today at the age of 85.

Dr. Hammond brought out his first respirator in 1909 and later received a patent. But he was never able to get it into production and failed to renew his patent. Because he let the matter drop, his claim to the invention was obscured.

Dr. Hammond was a general practitioner in Walls, Miss., just across the state line from here, from 1928 until his retirement three years ago.

He got the idea for his iron lung while suffering from an attack of pleurisy in 1906. While fighting for breath he wondered if he could reduce the air pressure over his lungs.

In his sickbed Dr. Hammond drew the preliminary sketches. On his first day out of bed he visited a carpenter/mechanic on the plantation where he lived near West Memphis, Ark., and they built a crude respirator, which fitted over the chest and was operated by hand.

The first iron lung contained no iron except the nails that held its wooden parts together. Rubber attachments made it airtight at the arms and waist, and a rubber tube led to the hand-operated bellows. Later a motor was added, and Dr. Hammond was issued a patent in 1909."

Phillip Hamman Family Association is now Tax Exempt

Family leadership has checked into requirements for Phillip Hamman Family Association (PHFA) to be tax exempt. We have done that by forming a 501 (c) (7) organization. This type of organization is called a "social association" and funds may be held in a bank account without requiring the PHFA to pay taxes on the money.

The PHFA now has Articles of Incorporation as well as Bylaws. We hope to have the link to view these documents available on the website soon.

Unfortunately, <u>donations</u> made to the Hamman Family Organization still are <u>not tax deductible for the</u> <u>donor</u>. That would require forming a 501 (c)(3) charitable organization, and our Hamman Association does not meet the requirements to be a 501(c)(3) charitable organization.


Captain James Cook is likely a Phillip Hamman Relative!



Gary Hamman submitted the following information he found about Valentine Cook. He decided to do a bit of research on the Cooks after friends sent him a picture of the Captain James Cook site in Newfoundland, Canada. The great grandfather of Phillip Hamman's wife,

Christina Cook, and the grandfather of Captain James Cook are the same man: John Cook (1670-1710). There is a Capt. James Cook Historic Site near Corner Brook, Newfoundland. Capt. Cook was

killed by local Hawaiians and is buried on the west coast of Hawaii about 10 miles south of Kona (19.481N, 155.933W).

The site of the Captain Cook Monument south of Kona, Hawaii can only be reached by watercraft, by kayak from Kahikolu, or by land via a steep hike. Jim and Nancy Rose visited this site several years ago by kayaking the mile across Kealakekua Bay. The snorkeling there is world class!

LANGUAGE.SINCE HER MOTHER WAS BORN IN ELGG, ZURICH, SWITZERLAND, SHE WAS EDUCATED AND NO DOUBT TAUGHT HER CHILDREN HER LANGUAGE.

As a farmer's daughter in York County, Pennsylania, she would have learned the duties of a female: cook, clean house, care for chickens, etc, When the family left Pennsylvania, she was 10 years old.

She would have continued these chores once settled at Cook's Fort.

HOW DID SHE AND PHILLIP HAMMAN MEET??Phillip Hamman served the Colonies during the Dunsmore War of 1774-75. In the same company were David Cook, Henry Cook and a Baughman. No doubt these 3 invited him home with them to Cook's Fort!! The 1775 tax list of the area lists Phillip Hamman as living at Cook's Fort!! So, they had several years to get acquainted!

THEIR MARRIAGE WAS THERE IN 1780.

Christina married **Phillip HAMMAN**, son of Johannes [John] HAMMAN, on 3 March 1780 in Cook's Fort, Greenbrier County, Virginia. Phillip was born in 1753 in New Jersey, or Maryland. He died on 3 August 1832 near Fackler, Jackson County, Alabama. He was buried on 3 August 1832 then moved from Fackler Farm to Valley Head Cemetery, DeKalb County, Alabama, 10 March 1972. Phillip was also known as Hammons.

Second Generation

 Valentine COOK was born in 1725 in Great Ayton, Marton-in-Cleveland, Yorkshire, England. He died in December 1797 in Cook's Fort, Greenbrier County, Virginia. He was buried in December 1797 in Cook's Fort, Little Level, Greenbrier County, Virginia. Valentine married Susanna BAUGHMAN about 1750 in probably York County, Pennsylvania.

Valentine was educated at In Amsterdam where he became fluent in Dutch and German. in BET 1738 AND 1750. His will was probated in December 1797 in Greenbriar County, Virginia.

NOTE: CHRISTINA COOK'S FATHER VALENTINE COOK WAS BORN IN YORKSHIRE, ENGLAND, MAKING HIM A BRITISH CITIZEN BUT HIS ETHNICITY WAS SCOTCH.

VALENTINE COOK, his family and relatives plus Vancouver Hanks and family left York County, Pennsylvania in 1773 headed tol Greenbriar County, Virginia where he had purchased 675 acres.

SOURCE: BAUGHMAN'S DEFEAT: Along the trail, near Crab Orchard, Kentucky, where they had camped for the night, the Indians attacked, killing mother of Susanna, brother-in-law John Ferrill and many others. Christina Cook had an arrow shot into her head as well as her 10-day old baby son was killed by an arrow. She went to a nearby home/store where her head arrow was removed. This was then Lincoln County, Kentucky. Later the group made the remainder of their journey to Little Level, on Indian Creek, Greenbrier County, Virginia - their destination. By 1775 Cook's Fort had been completed to house 300 persons.

3. **Susanna BAUGHMAN** was born on 24 August 1732 in Parish Elgg, Schottekine, Canton Zurich, Switzerland. She died on 12 October 1807 in Cook's Fort, Greenbrier County, Virginia. She was buried on 12 October 1807 in Cook's Fort, Little Level, Greenbrier County, Virginia.

M iv. Henry COOK was born in BET 1759 AND 1761 in Rockingham County, Virginia. He died in 1822 in Barren County, Kentucky.

Henry and his brother, John, were living in Lincoln Co. VA, now Lincoln Co. KY at least five years before Kentucky statehood. He received a Land Grant of 200 acres in Barren Co. KY dated July 26, 1799. He later received an additional 200 acres. By1800 Henry and his wife, Elizabeth, were living in Barren Co. KY where they lived the remainder of their lives. On August 6, 1808, Henry Cook, a resident of Barren Co. KY, gave power of attorney to his brother John to "transact all business, etc. and particularly to sell a tract of land in Monroe County, VA on Indian Creek, about five miles from Sulphur Spring, this land fomerly belonging to Valentine Cook, now deceased. "In 1820 Henry wrote his will, leaving all estate, both real and personal, to his wife, Elizabeth, who was named as Executrix and his son, William Cook as Executor. In 1827 the heirs of Henry Cook sold 266 acres of land to Randal Harlow, "this being land located at Blue Spring Grove where Elizabeth Cook, widow of Henry Cook, deceased, now lives." Life rights were reserved for Elizabeth Cook and two shares for the two youngest children who were "underage". The Henry Cook Family Bible, owned by Mr. J. M. Cook of Horse Cave, Barren Co. KY, lists the names and dates of birth of the children of Henry and Elizabeth Cook.

M v. **John COOK** was born on 6 January 1759 in York County, Pennsylvania. He died on 27 July 1832 in Stanford, Lincoln County, Kentucky. He was buried in Cook Cemetery, Stanford, Lincoln County, Kentucky.
